The 22-23 Academic Year was a year of being made new - the 1922-23 Academic Year, that is. The students showed up at the start of the year at Holy Rosary School, 3050 California Avenue SW. But after Christmas break, they instead made their

daily sojourn to Holy Rosary School, 4142 42nd Avenue SW.

It took just 10 years for us to outgrow our second home, on California Avenue, as we picked up the church and brought it with us so we could build a school after that first move. This time we picked up the school and brought it with us as we moved to a much larger new school building. The old school building would serve as the convent for the sisters, later remodeled into the Parish Center. There was nowhere for the priests to live, so they made a home out of a few classrooms in the new school building for six years until the rectory was finally constructed. And with no church, Sunday Mass took place in the School Hall for 14 years until that was built. In 1922-23 we discovered all sorts of newness.

Now, as we begin our second century in this school building, 2022-23 was also a year of being made new. We began the year with a new little toy, and ended the year with making our brick and mortar buildings like new with tuckpointing. But much more importantly, it is the students, staff and families whom God is making new each and every day. That is what school, and our wider parish community, are all about – each day learning and growing, new experiences, new opportunities, new goodness of God all around us. In this sense there is nothing routine about our lives as each day is new, and we should be as well. We have much to be thankful for, as we look back, and forward, to God's work in our midst and in our lives.
